Course Description:

A comprehensive look at the book of Daniel from a premillennial perspective, helping students gain a solid understanding of the content, interpretation and theology of the book.

Textbook:

Daniel by Stephen Miller (New American Commentary Series), ISBN: 0805401180

Learning Objectives:

- 1. The student will understand the exegetical process from translation to practical application.
- 2. The student will have a solid grasp of the chapter content of Daniel.
- 3. The student will be able to explain the challenging passages in Daniel.
- 4. The student will be able to articulate a biblical theology of Daniel.
- 5. The student will be able to draw devotional and practical lessons from the book of Daniel.

Quizzes

At the end of each class hour, a short guiz will gauge comprehension with 3-5 guestions over lecture material.

Readina

You will be asked to read through the book of Daniel at least ten times.

- Five or your readings are due before the beginning of class. On each of the first five days of class you will read through the book one additional time.
- · Each time you should complete the book in one sitting.
- As much as possible, vary your reading by using different translations or different forms (listening while reading or reading out loud with other students). Listening without also reading does not count.
- Additional readings will be worth 5 points of extra credit (up to 5x).

You will also be asked to read the introductory section of your textbook (pages 22-53). You will be asked to read the Daniel entry from Bob Bell's Old Testament Theology.

Theology of Daniel

Write a 10 page, double-spaced book theology of Daniel, covering the major theological topics that the book presents. Each heading should include specific verse references. Examples are available at the course page.

Annotated Notes

Annotate a printed copy of the book of Daniel. You can download a double-spaced copy of the book from the course webpage. These markings could be done during readings or during class. At the end of the class the documents will be collected and subjectively evaluated for completeness.
